Warning Signs **highlight**: Approximately **1 out of 3** human trafficking cases began as a tip to law enforcement, demonstrating the **importance** of **community awareness**.

STOP TRAFFICK: KNOW THE SIGNS If someone fits this criteria, they may be a victim of human trafficking

Living with employer . Poor living condiitons . Multiple people in cramped space . Inability to speak to individual alone • Answers appear to be scripted and rehearsed • Employer is holding identity documents • Signs of physical abuse • Submissive or fearful • Unpaid or paid very little

Connect: Human Trafficking + **Hunger**

How does human trafficking connect to hunger? Human trafficking is a "global epidemic driven by poverty," explains the Borgen Project, non-profit that works to end poverty and hunger worldwide. Food **insecurity** and **famine** are connected to human trafficking in the US and low-resource countries.


Learn more from the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) how food insecurity and famine increase an individual's vulnerability to trafficking.
