- * In **South Sudan**, thousands of children have been forced to join the military and other armed groups since the **civil war started in 2013**. In February, more than <u>300 child soldiers</u> were freed and <u>200 more</u> were released in mid-April. There are around **19,000 children** who are forced to be part of armed groups in South Sudan.
- * Actress Allison Mack has been charged with **facilitating sex trafficking**. This article explains how the women she **recruited** for a women's mentorship group were **exploited** and **blackmailed** by the group's leader, Keith Raniere, and the fact that **Mack may be a survivor of trafficking**, too.
