Human Trafficking + Halloween

In 2017, US Americans spent **9.1 billion dollars on Halloween candy**, according to Forbes.

Human trafficking expert Kevin Bales notes the estimated cost of sustainable freedom for the 27 million people in slavery in 2010 (there are estimated to be 40 million people in slavery in 2017) is around 10.8 billion dollars. We spend almost as much money on candy in a single month--9.1 billion dollars--as it would cost to liberate millions of people.

However, liberation is
not just the end of
trafficking; a long process of
rehabilitation and recovery follows.
Freeing enslaved peoples means helping
them build sustainable lives of dignity,
stability, economic autonomy, and

citizenship. The cost of freedom varies place to place. In the United States, legal and medical costs are among the most expensive, yet the **majority of people in**


